ABOUT THE PROJECT

DEV SKILLS project is based on an internal SWOT analysis of the organization NGO NEST Berlin which identified a skill gap which is crucial to enhance staff members competence in order to reach a wider audience of disadvantaged adult targets living in the metropolitan area of Berlin, specifically the target group of adult migrant NEETs in the frame of environmental skills. After an attentive research of the methodological offers the board agreed to aim for two of the key European best practices which can be exploited in the frame of Non Formal Education: the Blended Learning and the Digital Storytelling.

By means of Blended Learning and Digital Storytelling four main goals can be achieved:

1. Blended Learning will allow Nest Trainers to develop efficient and proper environmental education offer for adult migrant NEETs aimed at including them in the labour market.
2. Digital Storytelling will allow Nest Social Media staff in promoting the organization educational offer for adult migrant NEETs in a more appealing perspective.
3. Digital Storytelling will enable Nest Trainers to support the social inclusion in the community of adult migrants enabling them to communicate with the community with a tools that overthrow linguistic barriers.
4. Digital Storytelling, will provide added value for the employability programmes in virtue of its professional feature.

ABOUT TRAINING COURSE- Digital Storytelling

Digital storytelling allows participants to: tell their own stories, learn digital media skills, build confidence and self-esteem. The method places the stories under the control of the storyteller. Participants find digital storytelling fun: it is a way to reach people who think that education is 'not for them'; it can help to develop language and literacy skills through storytelling and script-writing; it can give people a kick-start in developing their skills and improving their chances to gain employment; it offers a way to engage thoughtfully with experience.

REIMBURSEMENT

While booking flights and/or other means of transportation, keep in mind that only public transportation and economy class are eligible.

The participants are expected to purchase their travel tickets will be reimbursed after each project activity, upon the presentation of relevant justifying documents and after completing post project activities (such as visibility and results dissemination) Following documents are obligatory for the reimbursement of travel costs:

1- Invoice showing the amount paid and name of the participant.

2- Tickets, boarding passes.

**Please note that the travel costs will be reimbursed on the real cost basis up to the maximum amount, in accordance with Erasmus+ program rules. In case of exceeding the maximum amount per person, participant should cover the difference.

**It is recommended to obtain travel health insurance which will cover period of your stay in Germany. For the participants coming from the EU member states it is recommended to obtain European Health Insurance Card.

**Health and Travel Insurance costs are not eligible for reimbursement.

**Accommodation and food expenses will be paid by hosting organization.

PARTICIPANTS REQUIREMENTS

1) Trainers acting as a tutor and supervisor during educational programs at local and international levels (5 trainees).

- Aged 20-35;
- Regular staff resources within the organization;
- Interested and motivated in acquiring knowledge and methodologies about Digital Storytelling to be employed in NEST's strategic orientations towards the empowerment of disadvantaged Adult migrant NEETs, by organizing local workshops of social inclusion and employability empowerment as well as in disseminating their learning outcomes in the organization (through specific internal Seminars targeted at their colleagues).
- Committed to attend the full duration of the course;
- Endowed with at least a working knowledge of English;
- Resident in Germany
- Participants should have basic command of English language as the Group consists of different people from different cultures and language.





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HOW TO REACH SASSARI

Sardinia can be reached by air at **3 airports** and by sea at **3 main ports**, with a wide variety of connections in particular during the tourism season - you can opt from the one suiting you best.

From Alghero Airport > by Bus to Sassari – approx. 30 km / 40 min.

Frequently serviced by the ARST company, the bus-stop is found going out of the airport at the right-side exit. You can Buy tickets at a machine close to the main entrance of the airport. At the end of the bus ride, you arrive at the Sassari bus station.

From Olbia Airport > by Bus + Train to Sassari - approx. 100 km / 2h

Take the city bus #.2 or 10 to the city center of Olbia where is the train station. The bus stops in front of the airport - going out of on the right side. Train-tickets you can buy online

Note: from the Sassari train station to the bus station is approx. 15 min. walk / covered by city busses.

From Cagliari Airport > by Train to Sassari - approx. 275 km / 3h

The train directly arrives at the airport.

From the Italian mainland as well as south of France, Spain up to Tunisia - Ferries arrive at the harbors if Porto Torres (well serviced by busses to Sassari); Olbia and Cagliari - check online for companies and timetables.





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Mobility City : Sassari

The venue of the project is Sassari, an Italian city located in the north west region of Sardinia. Sassari is the second-largest of Sardinia in terms of population and one of the oldest cities in the island with a large economy based on tourism and the services industry.



As a tourist destination, Sassari has a great deal of historical buildings and monuments. The city is rich in art, culture and history, and it is well known for its palazzi, the Fountain of the Rosello, and its elegant neoclassical architecture, such as Piazza d'Italia (Italy Square) and the Teatro Civico (Civic Theatre).

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WHAT TO BRING

- 1) a short description of the organization in English for the presentation to other participants and/or photos, brochures, newspapers or anything that can present activities of your organization;
- 2) medicine and health insurance (+optional travel insurance);
- 3) original e-tickets and invoices, train tickets, boarding passes, bus tickets etc. which will be fundamental in case of reimbursement;
- 4) your personal care products (shampoo, shower gel, hair dryer);
- 5) comfortable clothes and shoes adequate for the season of the year.

GOOD TO KNOW



- In Italy the unit of currency is Euro (€).
- We recommend you to bring enough cash because credit cards are not always accepted, for instance in small establishments.
- In Italy we have two types of three-pin earthed rear entry plugs: one has 4 mm in diameter pins while the other 5 mm in diameter pins. Don't forget to bring a universal adapter.
- It is better not to drink water from the sink.
- Usually shops close at lunch time (around 13:00/13:30) and reopen in the afternoon (between 16:00 and 17:00) and close around 20:00 or 20:30. Some shops or supermarkets do not do the lunch break.
- At the restaurant you will pay the coperto. It is a cost you pay for the occupation of the table (setting of the table, use of the cutlery, bread, and cleaning of the table).
- When you are at the restaurant, ask for the bill and they will bring it to your table.
- Lunch: approximately from 12:30 to 15:00. Dinner: approximately from 19:30 to 22:30.
- Breakfast: typical Italian breakfast is sweet, usually with milk and coffee and a croissant.
